Underline and identify all of the verb objects and complements in the following sentences (DO, IO, OC, PN, PA). Also, place parentheses around all prepositional phrases and draw arrows to show the word each modifies.

1) Abigail $\underline{\text{is}}$ $\overset{\text{S LV}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{PN}}{\searrow}$
 $\underline{\text{a calico.}}$

2) She $\underline{\text{is}}$ $\overset{\text{S LV}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{PA}}{\curvearrowright}$ (of that fact.)

3) She $\underline{\text{was}}$ $\overset{\text{AV}}{\swarrow}$ $\text{(in the parking lot)}$ $\text{(of a gentlemen's club)}$ $\text{(on a cold, sleet-filled evening.)}$
 NOTE THE PASSIVE VOICE.

4) I $\underline{\text{do}}$ $\overset{\text{S AV}}{\swarrow}$ $\text{not know [whether she is proud (of that fact).]}$ {Be careful with this one.}
 $\text{Subordinate clause acting as DO of main clause}$

5) (In the night,) $\underline{\text{she}}$ $\overset{\text{S AV}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{DO}}{\swarrow}$ $\text{hunts brushes and swim goggles.}$

6) I find them $\overset{\text{S AV DO}}{\swarrow}$ (at the foot) (of my bed) (in the morning.)

Adverbial
subord.
clause
7) $\overset{\text{S}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{Intrans. Verb}}{\underset{\text{Linking?}}{\swarrow}}$ When a mouse $\underline{\text{appeared}}$ $\text{(in the living room)}$, $\underline{\text{she}}$ $\overset{\text{S}}{\swarrow}$ $\text{ran the other way.}$

"the other way" is
a noun phrase
telling (where) she
ran. It is adverbial.

adverbial
noun
phrase
8) One day, I $\underline{\text{brought}}$ her Tilde.

9) Tilde $\underline{\text{is}}$ $\overset{\text{S LV}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{PN}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{S LV}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{PA}}{\curvearrowright}$ also a calico, $\text{(but she is a bit wild.)}$

"a bit" is yet another adverbial
noun phrase - this time limiting
or modifying the predicate adjective.

10) (In fact,) $\underline{\text{she}}$ $\overset{\text{S}}{\swarrow}$ $\overset{\text{PA}}{\curvearrowright}$ stark, raving feral.

11) Abigail sees Tilde (as an interloper) from barbarian lands.)

S LV PN S AV IO DO
12) They are not good friends, and I regularly give Orange the order to separate
them. {careful here.}

"to separate them" is
an adjectival infinitive
phrase.
