#### DIRECTIONS TO THE COLLEGE

**From North New Jersey:** Take Garden State Parkway South. Take Exit 44. Then right onto Port Republic Rd. Go  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. Turn left onto College Drive. Parking will be on your right in  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile.

**From Camden/Philadelphia Area:** Take Atlantic City Expressway to exit 12W. Turn left. Proceed straight and pass light at Rte. 30 (White Horse Pike), to next stop sign at Jim Leeds Rd., turn right — go 1 mile down Jim Leeds Rd. to College Drive. Turn left and continue about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles. Parking available on left.

**From Southern New Jersey:** Drive north on the Garden State Parkway to exit 36. Turn left on Tilton Road and travel past three traffic circles to the traffic light at Port Republic Road, just past the National Aviation Facilities Experimental Center (about five miles.) Turn right and continue down that road for about one mile. Cross Rte. 30 (White Horse Pike), and continue to the blinking light; then turn right and travel one mile east on Jim Leeds Road to the entrance to the College.

**From Atlantic City:** Travel west on Rte. 30 for about 10 miles to Pomona Shopping Center. Turn right at traffic light, proceed to stop sign, turn right onto Jim Leeds Rd., and travel about 1 mile and make a left onto College Drive. Go  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles. Parking available on left.

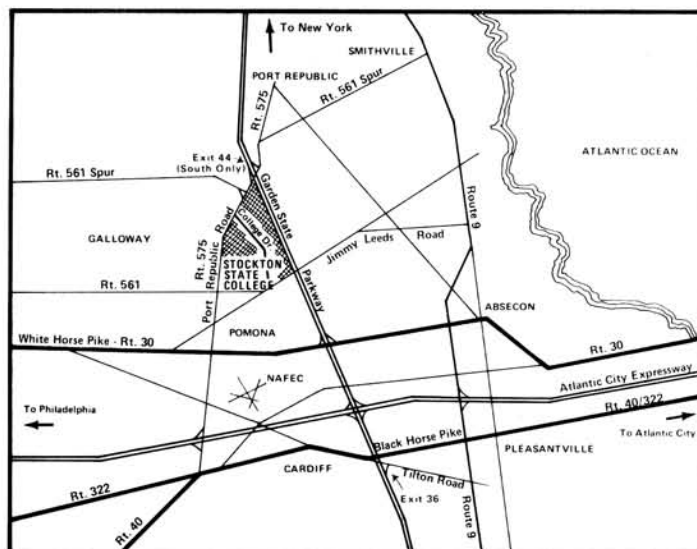
If travelling by bus or plane, you will probably need to rent a car or take a cab to and from the campus and your motel. Stockton's campus is somewhat isolated from any population centers and public transportation to and from campus is undependable.
