

Books: Stephen Dunn is the author of fifteen collections of poetry, including the recent *What Goes On*: Selected & New Poems 1995-2009. *Different Hours* won the Pulitzer Prize in 2001, and *Loosestrife* was a National Book Critics Circle Award finalist in 1996. His other W. W. Norton books are *New & Selected Poems*: 1974-1994, *Landscape at the End of the Century*, *Between Angels*, and *Riffs & Reciprocities*: *Prose Pairs*.

Local Time (William Morrow & Co.) was a winner of The National Poetry Series in 1986. A new & expanded edition of Walking Light: Memoirs and Essays on Poetry, was issued by BOA Editions, Ltd. in 2001.

Awards: Academy Award in Literature from The American Academy of Arts & Letters, Fellowships from the Guggenheim and Rockefeller Foundations, three NEA Creative Writing Fellowships, a Distinguished Artist Fellowship from the NJ State Council on the Arts, the Levinson and Oscar Blumenthal Prizes from *Poetry*, the Theodore Roethke Prize from *Poetry Northwest*, the James Wright Prize from *Mid-American Review*, and many others.

He is Distinguished Professor of Creative Writing at Richard Stockton College of New Jersey, but spends most of his time these days in Frostburg, Maryland where he lives with wife the writer Barbara Hurd.
