Sejal Shah's short stories, creative nonfiction, and poetry are forthcoming or have appeared in journals including *The Kenyon Review Online*; *Denver Quarterly*; *The Massachusetts Review*; *Indiana Review*; *Drunken Boat*; *Pleiades*; *Meridians*, and *Hanging Loose*, as well as in the books, *Indivisible: An Anthology of Contemporary South Asian American Poetry* (University of Arkansas Press), *Under Her Skin: How Girls Experience Race in America* (Seal Press), and *Contours of the Heart: South Asians Map North America* (Temple University Press). She is the recipient of an Academy of American Poets Prize as well as fellowship/residencies from Blue Mountain Center, the Millay Colony, the Djerassi Resident Artists Program, and the New York State Council for the Arts. She earned her BA from Wellesley College and her MFA in English from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. A native of Rochester, New York, she currently lives in New York City and teaches creative writing at Marymount Manhattan College.
